LSTA Grants

To provide innovative programs and services
Low application rate from Schools (hint hint)

- Open Grant Program-Revolving, up to \$4,999--to address a specific customer need or develop an innovative program idea. Allows applicants to apply a new method or solve a problem, build a program or service, and assist library in carrying out its mission and plan while helping the State Library address LSTA Goals.
- Competitive Grant Program- Due Sept 1: up to \$50,000, but **provide 25% cash match**--focus on one of 4 categories: Data Management & Analytics, Literacy, Outreach and Partnerships, STEM (or STEAM)

Digital Content

Library services and INFOhio services have changed and adapted as technology has developed
Expanding Access:

- Growth in automation
- Growth in digital content
 - (used 23.7 million times in 2014, 83,000 times per school day!)
- Creation of open ed resources
 - R4S, IMatrix, Go!, TechTools Pearltree, IWonder...aligns with ESSA goals for open source creation
- Seamless searching thru iSearch
 - Now contains all resources EXCEPT Ancestry.com!
- 90% of Ohio schools say they could not afford resources that INFOhio provides (without INFOhio)
- OhioNET provides discounts for databases
- Curation Tools are expanding: Curriculum Toolbox, IWonder, Pearlrees
- eResource Central: Gutenberg Titles and more
- Connect Schools and Content: learning.com (online safety curriculum), SketchUp, Stora
- ESSA: big change on how money flows into schools, block grants will be available
- #GoOpen: campaign to encourage schools to go open source with resources (OER) for schools. Big players: Follett, FutureReady.org (developing and housing resources for K-12 Ts and Ss) <http://futureready.org/open> , Creative Commons, EngageNY <https://www.engageny.org> , and local Ohio districts



- What's INFOhio's role regarding leadership in digital content?

Working on reading levels.

If full text is HTML you can click the item title and see the text.

Administrators think everything is free and online

Resistance in using INFOhio

Would love a statewide plagiarism checker

Table 2: (Joanna)

Critical that INFOhio is early adaptor (OER)

Password protection doesn't necessarily equate to OER (free in OHIO, but not world)

Who will VET this stuff?

Would like content available to easily put into Google Classroom

Common training needed?

Some teachers might be reluctant to freely share given current evaluation system

PD-getting teachers ready for teaching in a new environment (1:1, blended, flipped)
GAPE-huge push for Google in schools, esp in blended environment
Curation and vetting is necessary...is it age appropriate? Does it stretch but not become inappropriate?

Some districts are so needy. INFOhio is critical provider
Promotion is essential, as is PD
Needs for sharing formative assessments, SLO, standards tie-ins, etc
Could INFOhio partner with Engage NY?
Need directions, lessons, etc on how to embed things in LMS

Things need tied to standards
Need to go to users for desire on content
Just b/c it's free doesn't mean it's good: VETTING
Informational text and content needed

Polishing the 4-5 bingo: reviewed and revised the instructions and that the language matched the lingo in iSearch

Jigsaw puzzle activity: Who was...(grades 4-8, biography based) Come up with questions that they could search for in groups... each group answers one question and completes part of a larger jigsaw

Comment [1]: could one person be jigsawed among a group and then made into a larger jigsaw piece for Important Ohioans?

Polishers: teaching iSearch and citations. Worked on first teaching iSearch, then when teaching citations, use iSearch. Make a fill in bingo sheet that any teacher in any subject could use. Kids could fill the columns with the keywords they would search. Other suggestion: created a blended learning module for grades 6-8. Librarian does iSearch at beginning, then kids work

HS built a PD model that can be used about copyright...as a screen cast
